Out of School Hours Care Program

After School Care:

The Glenrowan Primary School operates an After School Program each weeknight throughout the school year. Care is provided in the Warby Wing classroom from **3.30pm until 6.00pm** each school day. The cost for each night is \$12.00. *(This is reduced by Child Care Subsidy CCS – see below).*

Vacation Care:

We also operate a Vacation Care Program on a needs only basis, for 2 weeks each of the four term school holidays, which provides care from **8.30am to 6.00pm**. The cost for one day of care is \$42.75 per child. *(This is reduced by Child Care Subsidy – see below).* Families are to supply their own lunch and snacks. The program may also include special excursions such as swimming and movies (COVID19 permitting), which are an additional charge to the daily cost. These days are advertised to families several weeks prior to the care and are invoiced to families at the end of the program.

Child Care Subsidy

Families may be eligible to claim some level of Subsidy. This benefit is in the form of a fee reduction depending on the number of dependants and combined income of your family. Low income families who hold a Health Care Card would pay approximately \$3.00 a night per child for After School Care and \$5.00 per child for one day of Vacation Care.

If you are a new family using the program, you need to contact the Family Assistance Office on **136150** to be assessed for your eligibility.

MyXplor

We use a software program called MyXplor to transmit the CCS data.

- When a child is enrolled into the software, the Primary Carer will receive an email to confirm and electronically accept the child's enrolment details (**Client Written Agreement CWA**).
- This then sends data to the Primary Carers MyGov account, which also requires to be electronically confirmed by the Primary Carer.

The completion of all of these steps, allows CCS eligibility to be advised to the school.

Accounts

Accounts are calculated and emailed to families at the end of each month. Prompt payment is required for your child to continue to utilise the program.

Program and Snacks:

The program includes a range of educational experiences including cooking, indoor/outdoor games, crafts, Lego, board games and many activities chosen by the children themselves. We provide healthy snacks each night including fresh fruit, sandwiches, biscuits and spreads. The weekly program and menus are included in the school newsletter.
